## Rules to Knit by

1. All registration forms must be received by Saturday, January 30, 2010 in order to participate.
2. There is an entry fee of \$ 10 per participant.
3. Participants may enter all 3 categories, or whichever categories they choose. There is only one entry fee.
4. All entries (that means socks, objects , or baby socks) must be received by Saturday, March 13. NO exceptions!  
\*If you are mailing your entry, please allow at least 1 week for priority mail or send via overnight, UPS, or FEDEX. The way your entries land here is YOUR choice. If you want them sent back to you, please include a postage paid envelope. We will donate all unclaimed entries to charity.
5. Use the pattern provided if you are knitting category #1. Open your mind to your knitting and be creative! Socks will be judged by how well you have followed the directions.
6. Ewe and Me Fiber Studio is not responsible for entries lost, damaged, or stolen.
7. Want to bring a guest? Participants may bring guests to the Gala. There is a \$5 fee for each guest. Please register your guests by March 13.

## "Socks Just Want to have Fun"

### Materials:

1 skein sock yarn (Pagewood Farm is our favorite)

Remember to choose your yarn so that it will compliment the design of your sock.

Size 1 or 2 needles (dpn, 2 circs, or magic loop, whatever works for you)  
or appropriate size for your knitting, markers, st holders, cable needles, etc.

CO 48, 56, 64, or 72 sts

Knit a cuff that is at least 1". Using a pattern of your choice.

Knit the leg of the sock at least 3" from where the cuff ends.

The heel, heel flap, foot, and toe are to be designed by you.

You could do a standard heel with heel flap and gusset, an afterthought heel, a short row heel, or a heel of your own design. You choose. The design patterns (found below) need to be worked into the sock at some point, which is up to the knitter. ALL design patterns listed need to be used in your sock. The knitter decides how the designs will fit in. The toe can be shaped anyway the knitter would like.

Please label your socks and items with the name of yarn used.

Your socks can be embellished in your own style if that is what you want.

### Honeycomb Stitch

Knit over a multiple of 4 sts

Row 1 - \*cross 2 front, cross 2 back; rep from \* to end.

Row 2 - knit

Row 3 - \*cross 2 back, cross 2 front; rep from \* to end.

Row 4 - knit

Repeat these 4 rows until desired length.

**Cross 2 back or Cross 2 front:**

knit into the back (or front) of the 2<sup>nd</sup> st on the needle; then knit the 1<sup>st</sup> st,  
slipping both sts off the needle at the same time.

### 1 x 1 Rib

Row 1 - knit 1, purl 1 to end of round.

Row 2 - knit 1, purl 1 to end of round.

Repeat row 1 and 2 until desired length.

### Seed Stitch Rib

Row 1 - knit

Row 2 - k3, p1, repeat to end of round.

Repeat rows 1 and 2 until desired length.
